The deadline for entries in the 2016 Lantern Awards program is July 15. Eligible entries must have been produced between May 1, 2015 and April 30, 2016.



Entries submitted prior to July 1, 2016, will be \$55 per entry. Entries submitted between July 1 and July 15 will be \$65 per entry.

A professional member who submits and pays for three or more entries at one time will receive a \$5 discount per entry (\$50/\$60). All student entries will be \$20 per entry.

There will be no additional extended deadline. All materials will be submitted via an online entry website only; NO binders will be accepted.

Gambel is the first woman from Louisiana to be inducted into the Southern Public Relations Federation's PR Hall



In Memoriam: Sally Kuzenski

Long-time friend and fellow practitioner Sally Kuzenski recently passed away. If you would like to send a note to the family, you'll find that info below.

Retired journalist **Sally Thompson Kuzenski** died June 3, 2016 at Santa Rosa Beach, Florida. She was 83, and a native of the Mississippi Delta.

She leaves her husband, Kenneth F. Kuzenski of Santa Rosa Beach, FL, and children J. Kenneth (& Nan) Kuzenski of Raleigh, NC, Delta Kuzenski of Santa Rosa Beach, and John C. (& Zsuzsanna) Kuzenski of Apex, NC. She also leaves a brother, Mickey Thompson of Cleveland, MS, and sister, Nancy Thompson Petty of Brandon, MS. Preceding her in death were her loving parents, C. Thornton and Hazel Thompson of Merigold, MS, and brothers Rex Thompson of McCool, MS, Grover Thompson of Clarksdale, MS and Pat Thompson of Merigold, MS.

Kuzenski was a **30-year veteran of Louisiana State University** where she served as **Director of LSU News Service and Assistant Director of Public Relations**. She was the recipient of some 50 regional and national

awards for writing and public information planning, including the President's Award from the National Mosquito Control Association. Her numerous science articles were picked up by both the national and international press.

Honored at the annual meeting of the 1997 Louisiana Higher Education Public Relations Association, Kuzenski was described by the state's higher education commissioner as "foremost in her field," and a person who had broken the gender gap in state and regional public relations.

Kuzenski was past president of Baton Rouge Press Club, the Public Relations Association of Louisiana (PRAL), Southern Public Relations Federation, and Louisiana Higher Education Public Relations Association. She was the first woman inducted into the PRAL Hall of Distinction.

In her early career as columnist-reporter for the Baldwin Times in Bay Minette, AL, Kuzenski was named Spanish Fort's 1964 Neighbor of the Year for her work in helping get Interstate I-10 rerouted across Mobile Bay.

Funeral services were held at Point Washington Methodist Church on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, with burial at Gulf Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, the

Senior Practitioners WANTED

2016 Senior Practitioner Guidelines

Each year, SPRF member organizations (ECPRO, PRAL, PRAM, and PRCA) and their respective chapters are invited to identify up to two professionals per local chapter to be recognized as SPRF Senior Practitioners. The Senior Practitioner designation was established to honor members of SPRF who are recognized by their peers as veteran public relations professionals with high ethical standing. Recipients of this designation are announced at the SPRF annual conference.

Guidelines for Nomination:

- 1. Nomination and selection is made by each local chapter based on criteria set by the Southern Public Relations Federation. To receive the designation "Senior Practitioner," a recipient must meet three of the following four criteria:
 - 15 years of full-time public relations experience
 - Accreditation by a UAB member organization
 - Officer or board member at chapter, state or SPRF level
 - Recognition of professionalism as evidenced by such awards as Professional Achievement Award, Lantern Award or similar honor.
- 2. Nominees may be designated as a senior practitioner only one time in their career.

- 3. Submit nominations via e-mail to: Ron Barnes, APR, VP Professional Development, <u>ronbarnes@coastepa.com</u>. (You can find the form on our website or email Ron for a copy.)
- 4. Deadline Nominations must be received by Friday, July 29, 2016.


